
In October guys from the Rock of Refuge church plant, the Cornerstone Christian Church plant on the north coast and several small churches near Tegucigalpa learned and practiced nine new ways to experience "The Real/Royal Life" with God". This camp was based on John Eldridge's book Get Your Life Back. Most every camp we memorize Scripture; this time we chose dozens of verses from the book of Psalms. Pray for our men to rise up to be servant leaders in their homes, jobs and communities.

A Not So Small Herd

We are slowly, judiciously hosting a few retreats each year from sister churches at CRC. We want to help groups of leaders and groups that have limited resources. The First Church plant's Manada Pequeña (Little Herd) drama troop camp (Oct 30-31) brought over 53 children, youth, and adult leaders to our 7.7 acre campus.



This is the third camp that the first church plant has done at CRC this year. In June we hosted 60 during their ladies' day retreat and in July eight of their youth leaders came for a two day retreat.



A team of Honduran women leaders took

two mission trips since our last newsletter:
one to Botijas to visit a pastor's wife, Reina, in the
mountains to encourage the women there and also to El
Florida, to minister to Delsis' home town near the border
of El Salvador. Both Reina and Delsis have been asking
for several years for our women's group to visit their
home towns. It was quite a joy to be able to share Christ
with the people of these two small towns.



It is hard to believe that 21 years have passed since we had the privilege of starting the Rock of Refuge church plant. To celebrate, the church decided to do a pot luck dinner. We call it a pot luck because everyone brought food to share. However, the ladies still served each plate, as buffet lines make Hondurans uncomfortable. We had around 110 folks turn out for this celebration of thanks to God for his work in our lives.

Honduras Elects a New President

November 28th the Honduran people chose a new political party to lead the country. It has been a peaceful election, which we thank God, as many were anticipating political riots. We ask for your prayers that all Honduran leaders would be protected from evil influences and would govern well. Pray that there would be continued peace and freedom, and that the Gospel would continue to advance unhindered. Some of the social policies of the president elect, like abortion

on demand, could lead Honduras down a Godless path. Pray for the elected leaders of what has been a Catholic nation to resist this and other sins.
