Other fun games and the obstacle course helped the youth get

to know each other better. Dramas and worship, followed by Manuel's message, made for a terrific campfire.

The small team of men all from the same congregation in South Carolina checked off a bunch of our handyman tasks, but they also did a great job of sharing their lives, wisdom and testimonies with us and the Hondurans they met. In several homes they shared their stories with new believers and people who had not yet made the commitment to follow Jesus. They preached, gave a testimony and participated on a panel discussion for men at the church in Tegucigalpa.

They also encourage Teri and I greatly with their passion for their church back home. Through all their testimonies and regular conversations, it became apparent that these guys loved Jesus, their church back home, the lost, and serving others.

Her mission in Guatemala has churches in urban settings as well as in the mountains, where the people speak different dialects and wear traditional dress. Over Thanksgiving weekend, at Lucy's request, Teri journeyed with four leaders from the Honduran women's conference to the capital city of Guatemala to lead a pastors wives conference. They used the same theme of Fervent from Priscilla Shirer's book on fervent prayer, as they had in September. The Honduran leaders worked extra hard on their messages taking into account the presence of the ladies from the mountains. The team from Honduras taught main sessions and workshops, helped with games and worship times. Friday night's worship stations were a favorite part of the two day conference. While the pastors wives and women's ministry leaders drew closer to Jesus and their sisters of a different culture, the Honduran team experienced the joy of ministering directly to their Guatemalan counterparts.






#### Pajama Party


