CRC, Las Crucitas, Tegucigalpa

Tow I'm in trouble," I thought as the 3/4 inch
water valve came off in my hand and a torrent
of water shot past my head. Ainey, one of the women's
conference speakers, had painstakingly cleaned out
Camp Bagope's baptistry and asked me for help filling
it. I managed to make a PVC plug for the 2 inch drain,
and had the watchman reveal the location of the elusive
control valve.

The large, rectangular cement baptistry had been built on the back of the chapel with two sets of stairs. Now it had a few untended cracks and glass shards from a broken window embedded in the grass at the foot of one of the stairs. We repaired the valve, picked up the glass, and filled the tank to the top twice because it leaked some overnight.

I could not help thinking of how the state of disrepair of this central fixture of this camp ground testifies to the way Honduran pastors neglect the acts of baptism and marriage. Many leaders will not teach or practice baptism for fear of baptizing someone who could later bring shame on their ministry by stumbling in their new faith. Similarly many couples who come to Christ can not get married because of a church policy or a pastor's reluctance. One local pastor said, "If we marry one couple in our church, then other couples would follow which would mean extra work." Some churches only marry baptized members, while other churches only baptize people married in the church.

So we on occasion have had the honor of marrying couples that others won't or of baptizing folks who

have been waiting for a pastor to allow it. In some cases, it is literally an act of defiance for these people to follow God's commands and prompting.

Our meddling with the status quo can lead to awkward moments and, sadly, even church discipline as disciples strive to follow Christ where their leaders are not willing to take them. Exploding valves and dirty leaky baptistries are only symptoms of the problem.



Discovery Studies

Roca de Refugio, Tegucigalpa
It happened again. Two of the
disciples of our disciples started
a discovery study in the home of some
of their close friends. Third generation
disciples are signs of a healthy disciple
making movement. So when Jony and Ana
evangelized Darwin and Jessica and family
with the help of our Thursday night team
and then Jessica and Darwin started a
study with Angelina and her family, we
celebrated God at work.

Our team plans to start new discovery studies with three young ladies who are neighbors to the Church while we are in the U.S. for Josh and "Janet's" wedding. These three young people attended the women's conference and accepted the challenge to follow fervently after Christ.



The women and girls were challenged to be fervent in prayer for themselves, their families and others and to be vigilant and valiant in our spiritual struggle against our adversary. Many women expressed afterward that they felt God moving in this conference in a special way.

221 women, teens and girls from over 31 Central American churches rode in on busses, vans and cars. While most of women came from Honduras, 17 came from three churches in Guatemala. Several US missionary ladies working in Honduras participated, as well as at least one representative from Mexico, El Salvador, Costa Rica, and Panama.
