

The next three days were filled with soccer and American football drills and scrimmages, along with songs, testimonies and devotionals. 
encounter, she also told me that three families, totaling 14 people, lived in that particular cluster of houses.

Men's Camp August 9-11 CRC, Las Crucitas, Tegucigalpa

Hiking, games, a challenge course, worship,
Scripture memory work and repelling a
waterfall are all mainstays in our annual men's camp. A
team from Kansas helped make this camp extra special

by teaching six sessions around the theme "Fathered by God" based on the book by John Eldrege. The participation of men and pastors from four new churches added to the adventure and helped us to more than double last year's attendance.

We hosted three teams this summer. Most recently at the end of August, 10 women from all over the United States came and helped Teri with this year's women's conference. She couldn't have done it without them.

At the beginning of August, a church near Wichita, Kansas helped Jim with the annual men's camp, teaching the main sessions. Kayt (the only lady on the team) spoke at the women's tea and also taught the Sunday school teachers in the Tegucigalpa church. They also helped us get our upstairs lighting installed.

Back in July, a team from South Carolina came for a week to visit. Not only did they put on a sports camp as an access ministry to the mountain village in Isopo but they also joined us in our Hike and campfire activity.

After months of building up the site with retaining walls, and tons of fill, and after hand pouring all the footings, we are finally seeing the 14 brick columns slowly rising up from the ground for what will be approximately a 45 x 68 foot open air chapel. The arches that connect the tops of the columns and will hold up the roof will be topped on two sides with large concrete and brick water channels.



The future worship, teaching and fellowship center of the CRC is nestled in the forest next to our recreation field and across the lane from the shower house. It will serve as a place to get out of the sun or rain and as a giant water collector, capable of catching and storing thousands of gallons of water for campers, staff and teams.

We currently have several neighbors working on the project and hope to have the chapel ready for inauguration in December.
